Courses

This year, we have organized courses designed to educate healthcare professionals. Notably, we supported a Urodynamics Course at the Evelina Children's Hospital (thanks to Anne Wright and Jo Clothier), which received positive feedback from participants eager to deepen their understanding of diagnostic practices. Additionally, we had a fully booked ICCS course in Utrecht (thanks to Anka Nieuwhof-Leppink) and another in Doha (thanks to Ananda Nacif). On September 8th, ICCS will promote a course in collaboration with the Sociedad Iberoamericana de Urología (SIUP) in Panama (thanks Anna Bujons).

Webinars

Our commitment to continuous education is reflected in the series of webinars we have conducted. Topics such as Reflux and Bladder-Bowel Dysfunction (BBD), Uroflowmetry, and the Preparation of the Lower Urinary Tract in Transplanted Children have been particularly well-received. These sessions have allowed for interactive dialogue and engagement among professionals in our field. Furthermore, we have a robust lineup of additional webinars scheduled for the remainder of the year, and we encourage all members to participate.

Standardization Documents

In our ongoing efforts to establish best practices, we are currently preparing five standardization documents on critical topics, including:

- 1. Terminologies in Lower Urinary Tract Dysfunction (updated).
- 2. Clean Intermittent Catheterization.
- 3. Uroflowmetry.
- 4. Psychological Changes and Urinary Incontinence.

5. Psychological Changes and Fecal Incontinence and Constipation.

These documents aim to provide clarity and consistency across our practices, benefiting both clinicians and patients alike.

Bedwetting Day

We also celebrated Bedwetting Day on May 31st with an awareness campaign designed to educate families and empower them with knowledge about bedwetting. This day serves as a critical platform for educating parents, caregivers, and the broader community about the realities of bedwetting, aiming to demystify the condition and foster a deeper understanding.

As we prepare for our ICCS Annual Meeting, preparations are underway to ensure that this event is both informative and engaging. The meeting will serve as a platform for sharing recent findings, networking, and collaborating on new projects.
